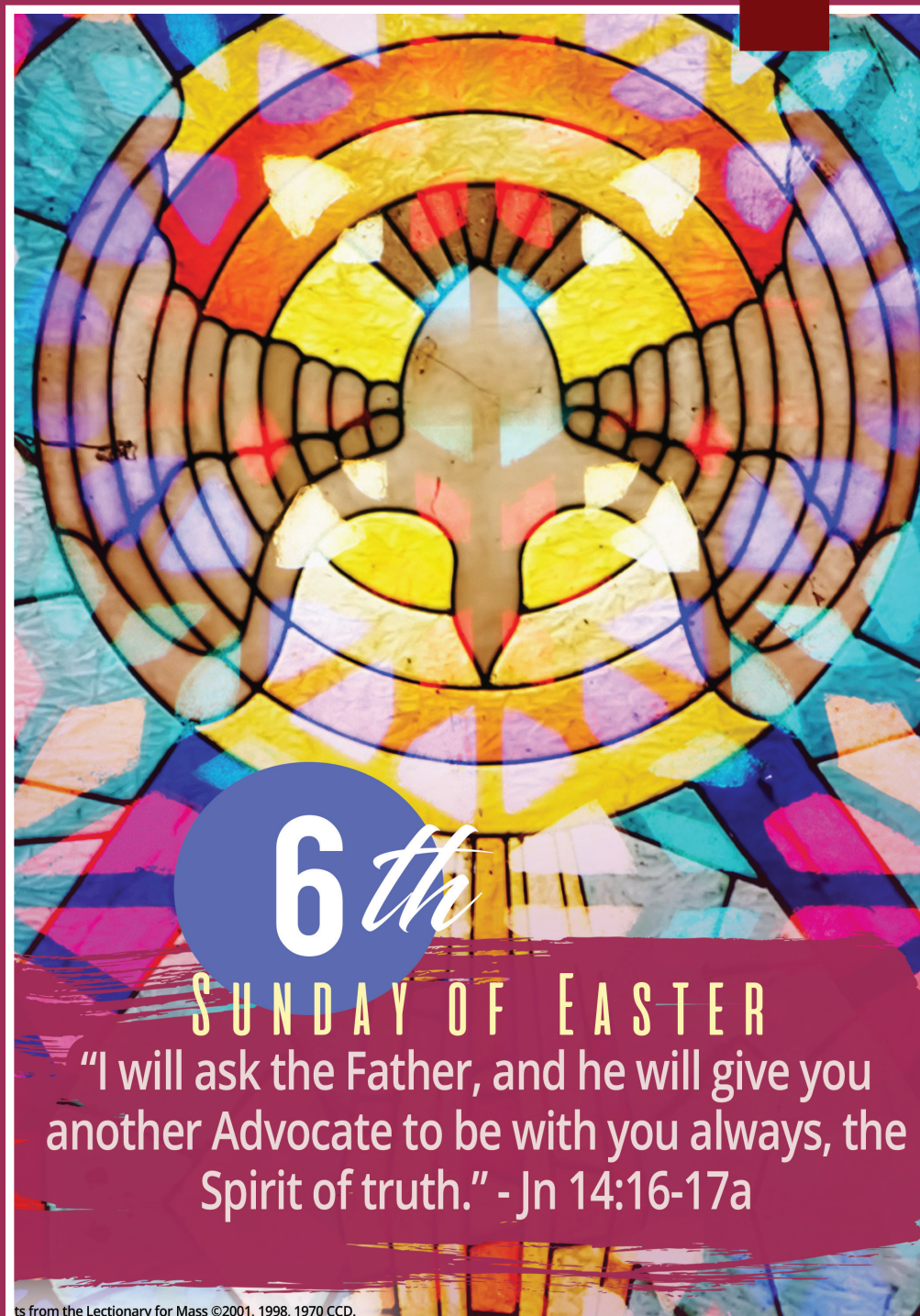

AN INSTRUMENT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

It's hard for me to admit, but when I first started teaching the Confirmation program here two years ago, I didn't really have a relationship with the Holy Spirit. God and Jesus? We spoke every day. I learned what I could about them and from them. But that third person of the Holy Trinity? Not so much.

As my first year teaching Confirmation went on, I realized just how important that relationship is. I wouldn't have gotten through that first year of ministry without the Holy Spirit. There were so many times I called on him as the year went on. I was learning as I went, and when I felt lost, he was right there. And as I stressed about preparing for the Confirmation ceremony for the first time, someone told me not to worry; the Holy Spirit always shows up.

The Gospel this week tells us who the Spirit is: an Advocate and the Spirit of truth. The Holy Spirit *"remains with you, and will be in you."* And that's what I've tried to emphasize to our Confirmation students as I've learned it myself: when you need help, the Spirit will guide you. He will guide you with the wisdom and understanding needed to tackle any situation. He is with you always. He's the little nudge God places inside of us, encouraging us to do what's right and helping us to align our will with God's.

I've spent the past year calling on the Holy Spirit more than ever before. Before every Confirmation class, I'd pray that he'd be with us and guide us to open our hearts to whatever was the lesson that day. Before any talk I'd give to the middle schoolers or high schoolers, I'd ask him that the words I speak be his, not mine. Because I know the Holy Spirit has important lessons to bestow upon us. And maybe one of the best things we can be in this world is an instrument of the Holy Spirit. An example of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. An example of God's love to others.

With life being as crazy as it is right now, perhaps this is the greatest time to remember this. About nine days before Confirmation this past Saturday, we got word that Confirmation was still going to happen. That gave everyone nine days to prepare for two ceremonies in the midst of a global pandemic. There were so many people who put incredible work into making this happen. The chapel had to be reconfigured, the teens had to be prepared without a rehearsal, there had to be a way to clean the chapel between the ceremonies, the actual liturgies had to be planned and so on.

But, in the midst of all this chaos, the most important thing happened. The Holy Spirit showed up. And, come Saturday, that was what mattered most. These teens had the opportunity to celebrate what they had been preparing for all year, and I think everyone could feel a spirit of peace and joy. It's the most beautiful reminder that brings peace to my heart. Even amidst a world filled with fear and panic and sadness, true joy resides. The Holy Spirit has shown up and will continue to, every time. All you have to do is call out.

SUNDAY READINGS

FIRST READING (ACTS 8:5-8, 14-17)

Philip went down to the city of Samaria and proclaimed the Christ to them. With one accord, the crowds paid attention to what was said by Philip when they heard it and saw the signs he was doing. For unclean spirits, crying out in a loud voice, came out of many possessed people, and many paralyzed or crippled people were cured. There was great joy in that city.

Now when the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent them Peter and John, who went down and prayed for them, that they might receive the Holy Spirit, for it had not yet fallen upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit.

SECOND READING (1 PT 3:15-18)

Beloved: Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit.

GOSPEL (JN 14:15-21)

Jesus said to his disciples: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you. Whoever has my

commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."

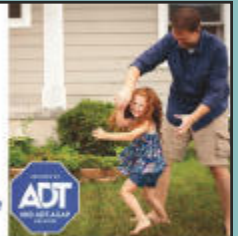
