## Statement of the Missouri Catholic Bishops on the Death of George Floyd and its Aftermath

We, the Catholic bishops of Missouri, wish to express our anger and sadness at the senseless death of George Floyd. This tragedy tears open a wound that hasn't completely healed in Missouri following the death of Michael Brown. It also once again opens up our state and nation to unnecessary violence and destruction. We wish to clearly state that we denounce police brutality in any form, especially in any form motivated by racism, or by a disregard for persons based upon the color of their skin. We also denounce violence and property destruction as a means of countering violence.

We must find a way to live peacefully together, respecting the racial and ethnic differences among us. Racial and ethnic injustice continues to exist in our state and in our country, and we cannot turn a blind eye to it. We must ask ourselves what systemic changes are needed to address it. We must also honestly examine our hearts and ask God to eradicate any vestige of it that might lie there. We cannot do this on our own. No human power can eradicate racism; we need the assistance of a higher power. We call upon Catholics and people of good will to pray for an end to racism, bias, and prejudice within ourselves and within our communities. Recalling the gift of Pentecost celebrated this past weekend, through which God sends the Holy Spirit to unite a scattered and divided human family, may the Holy Spirit guide us into all truth concerning the dignity of every human person, and may Jesus Christ gather us together into fellowship with the Father.

This weekend, we ask the Catholic pastors throughout the province of Missouri to include in their petitions at Mass, a prayer for racial harmony and an end to violence.

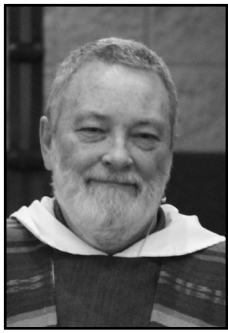

## DISCOVER MORE FULLY THE MYSTERY



**FR. RICH**

### **T**raditional version of the Nicene Creed:

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds; God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made.

Who, for us men for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate

by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried; and the third day He rose again, according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits on the right hand of the Father; and He shall come again, with glory, to judge the quick and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord and Giver of Life; who proceeds from the Father [and the Son]; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets.

And I believe one holy catholic and apostolic Church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

### **Traditional Version of the Apostles' Creed:**

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth;

And in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord;  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, dead, and buried;\*  
the third day he rose from the dead;  
he ascended into heaven,  
and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty;  
from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic\*\* church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting. Amen.

The idea of a triune God is organic. For us, it is grounded in the experiences and words of the Jewish Testament and refined in the words and experiences of the evangelists and writers of the Epistles. Even though our own experience is rooted in these foundations, the Triune God remains a central mystery of our Catholic faith.

The two creeds that we have available to us underwent several iterations before they developed into their current form. Both center on the trinitarian nature of the Godhead. Even they continue to be

examined and discussed as scholars and theologians try to discover more fully the mystery they contain. As is frequently the case, we are prone to collapsing complex issues into simple mantras. Here is an example that I've run across in my travels: "God Creator, redeemer, source of all wisdom."

This triune expression, even as it simplifies, does nothing to dispel the mystery that is the Triune God of our faith. I would offer that it is not supposed to resolve the questions and wonderments that surround our God.

Theological mysteries are supposed to draw us in, to challenge us to delve more deeply in a personal, relational search for how we see, understand, and love this Godhead. Although the study of theological texts is important to our search, it is more complicated than studying. We are drawn into the mystery by our own desire to deepen and strengthen the intimacy with which we love God — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is about how we experience this God in our lives and how we experience God's power, love, and creative drive. It is about how we manifest that presence in our relationships with those around us, in our relationship with our world.

In the literary world, mystery writers usually can bring their stories to successful conclusions. The murderer is brought to justice, the treasure is found, answers sought after are resolved. Not so for us and the mystery of the Triune God. Even if we reduce it to "God Creator, Redeemer, Source of all wisdom," we are no closer to an understanding of the nature and truth of the Trinity. I'm okay with that, as I seek a deeper, more intimate relationship with that same God. Join me.

### **FIRST READING (EX 34:4-6, 8-9)**

Early in the morning Moses went up Mount Sinai as the LORD had commanded him, taking along the two stone tablets.

Having come down in a cloud, the LORD stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, "LORD." Thus the LORD passed before him and cried out, "The LORD, the LORD, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." Moses at once bowed down to the ground in worship. ### GOSPEL (JN 3:16-18)

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

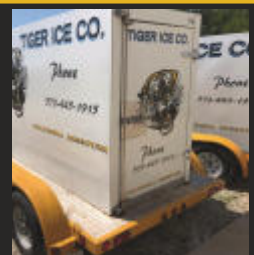
