DISPENSATION EXTENDED THROUGH SEPTEMBER

All the faithful of the Diocese of Jefferson City, and those who are present in the territory of the Diocese, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation until 11 September 2020, provided that for days of precept after 1 July 2020 they do one of the following:

- Participate in the Sunday or holy day of obligation Mass livestreamed from their parish church or chapel, the Cathedral, or the Vatican.
- Prayerfully read and meditate on the readings of the Mass for the Sunday or holy day of obligation, and recite the rosary.
- Prayerfully read and meditate on the readings of the Mass for the Sunday or holy day of obligation, and recite the Divine Mercy chaplet.

PUBLIC HEALTH INFORMATION

In the continued interest of the safety of our staff and parishioners and per city ordinance, anyone over the age of 10 entering the building will be required to wear a face covering. We encourage and advise children over the age of 2 to wear a face covering as well, in accordance with CDC guidelines. Please continue to refrain from attending mass in person if you are not feeling well.

PARKING LOT CHANGES THIS FALL

MU has released their lease on our parking lot. As such, Newman has sold some permit parking spaces to students, faculty and staff and has retained visitor spaces. For those coming to Newman for mass, to pray, for meetings, etc, your experience will not be very different. We will have expanded area for visitor parking (marked by yellow parking spaces and new signage). You will still need to sign in during business hours (except if just coming for daily mass). Weekends and evenings will be the same where our lot (and adjacent University parking) will be available.

In the transition from MU's control back to ours, we anticipate one-time "growing pains." We ask for your patience and understanding for the last two weeks of this month (August 14-31) as parking may be difficult. Starting September 1, our new system will be in place and we anticipate relatively smooth sailing moving forward!

FOOD BANK

Earlier this week, the Food bank decided they will continue to need volunteer support through this Friday and Saturday.

If you meet the following requirements, they ask that you consider signing up to help support us on Friday (8/7) from 12:30 - 2:30 p.m. and 2-4 p.m. or Saturday (8/8) from 9:30 a.m.-noon.

- All volunteers must be over 18 years old
- All volunteers must be able to work outside and dress appropriately for the weather
- All volunteers must be able to lift 35 pounds repeatedly
- All volunteers must follow all safety instructions, including wearing a mask and gloves for the entirety of their shift, staying within designated volunteer areas, and following basic food safety requirements
- All volunteers will be asked to complete a safety check list before starting their shift with us. If you do not meet all our requirements, we will have to ask that you not volunteer with us that day.


UPCOMING FEAST DAY MASS
