

EXPECT MORE THIS ADVENT

his past week I found myself shopping for chicken soup for a certain sick pastor... I guess I never realized how many options there are for canned soup. I went directly to the section of the aisle with the Campbell display and searched for soups of various chicken flavors amid the overwhelming amount of Campbell and store-brand options that were piled in front of me. After I filled the top part of my cart with homestyle chicken and noodle, healthy option chicken and noodle, chicken and rice, chicken and stars, and

even a can of soup where the noodles are shaped like characters from the movie Frozen, I started to leave the aisle and realized that the options for soup actually continue past the Campbell/generic label section. What I thought was just the baked beans section was actually Progresso and a whole bunch of other hearty soup options. Now I am not saying that Campbell's Chicken Noodle is a lesser soup...but I was definitely limiting the scope of what was available. What if God is desiring to give me a hearty reality, full of flavor and meat and vegetables, and I am focusing on chicken broth with a few noodles and a couple small chunks of processed meat? What if the great things he has planned for me just look like baked beans out the corner of my eye? What do I need to do to step back and recognize the magnitude of God's desires for me?

This may be a jump, but this is why I love the Advent season. It is a time that is meant to stretch us and prepare us - to widen our hearts to receive more fully the promise; to look at our experiences from a bigger perspective; to have our expectations blown out of the water! The Christmas Story is so unexpected, it makes sense that we would need to prepare. It reveals things about our God and the way he works, how his plans are so much bigger than what we can plan for ourselves. Look up! Look around! Bethlehem, shepherds, a manger? This was so unexpected, but so perfect. A baby would free us, not a warrior? The story of salvation is a lot to take in, because honestly, it is not how we as humans would plan it. Yet, if we allow ourselves the time to observe the many aspects of it and ponder the mystery of how it came to be, we come to know the greatness of our God more fully and the beauty of his desires for humanity. As we try to control and plan our own lives, how often would we actually be better off abandoning ourselves to God's plan for us...allowing him to provide and guide us in ways that may be a little unexpected for us?

This season is given to us to widen our perspective and see how the Incarnation is not only a single moment in history, but is still remains a magnificent reality with eternal fruits experienced daily by God's sons and daughters. Our preparation for Christmas then becomes, not only for the celebration of the birth of Christ, but also a preparation for the Second Coming of Christ and every moment in between that he is made present in our lives.

EXPECT MORE THIS ADVENT

The time we put into Advent, into intentionally widening our hearts and minds to the mystery, directly relates to our ability to enter into the Christmas Season and receive the great promises from our God. Don't settle this Advent season, expect more - expect to grow and be transformed. Let's allow the mystery to stretch us, so that we may have the capacity to receive more than we were planning.

CHRISTMAS MASSES AT NEWMAN



A STEWARD'S WAY

END OF YEAR GIVING

Did you know that 30% of charitable giving occurs in December and 10% of giving occurs in the last three days of December? So, if you're still working out your 2020 charitable contributions, you're not alone! As a reminder, to be credited as



a 2020 financial contribution for tax purposes, your donation must be received at Newman by Thursday, December 31, 2020. Anything received after 12/31/20, regardless of the date, must legally be listed as a 2021 contribution. Remember, online transactions often take 1-2 days to process, so a gift made on 12/31/2020 may or may not appear on your 2020

As the tax climate continues to change, please keep yourself educated and aware of the ways that you can give which may be tax advantageous for you. This could mean giving appreciated stocks, through your required minimum distribution, or other assets. Please remember that these options may take several business days to process.

In 2020, the CARES Act created a universal charitable deduction which is an above-the-line deduction and will be available to taxpayers who take the standard deduction. In addition, the CARES Act lifts the cap on annual contributions for those who itemize, increasing it from 60% to 100% of AGI for 2020. Any excess contributions available can be carried over to the next five years. For details, consult your tax advisor.

If you would like to talk through your options or need assistance, please contact the office and we would be happy to help. Regardless of how you choose to give and even how much you choose to give, know that the Newman Center is committed to stewarding you and your gifts. As we look toward 2021 in hope, we look forward to how the Spirit is moving our community to bless us with His abundant love! ECREE FROM BISHOP McKNIGHT

DISPENSATION EXTENDED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

All the faithful of the Diocese of Jefferson City, and those who are present in the territory of the Diocese, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation **until further notice**, provided that they do one of the following:

- Prayerfully participate in the Sunday or holy day of obligation Mass livestreamed from their parish church or chapel, the Cathedral, the Vatican, or of any Mass of the day celebrated in communion with the Roman Catholic Church.
- Prayerfully read and meditate on the readings of the Mass for the Sunday or holy days of obligation, and recite the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet.
- The faithful still have the obligation to keep the Lord's Day holy and "to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body" (CCC 2185)



INTERFAITH GARDEN END-OF-SEASON **REPORT**

The volunteers at the Interfaith Garden would like to once again thank Catholic Charities of Central and Northern Missouri for your \$1000 grant which was given to us in March of this year. We were able to use the money to buy a large garden cart, a wheelbarrow with dolly (see picture below, with the old and broken one in the background), and concrete blocks to build a raised bed.
