

ost of us are quiet people. who desire to live a good and holy life, promote the values and mission of the Gospel as best we can and desire to one day inherit the surprise of life eternal God promises to us. We are not trail blazers. We are simple people who want

to do the simple things of life well. But there are others who left a more profound impact along the way of the paths they walked. Folks like Dorothy Day, Martin Luther King, Thomas Merton, Gandhi, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and many others left lasting impacts and legacies. Like Moses, they show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose driven life look like. They show us how to be holy. We need Moses people like these to give us inspiration, hope and an example of holy living.

We do not need to do what they did or even mirror their relationship with God. Each one of us is God's special creation, with a purpose and soul known only to us. We need to learn how to open up and bring, without compromise, our soul-ness to life. We know when someone is authentic and centered because they always point to truth, even though they struggle and sin themselves, and they embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and it astonished many who listened. We do not need to move mountains, advance a cause, write books or become notable. All we have to do is become credible witnesses of the faith we profess. Moses people can teach us how to do this.

St. Oscar Romero was an amazing man and a Moses figure for sure. He saw God in the burning bush and brought the flame of Gospel faith to the poorest of the poor, challenging the evils of the society in which he lived. He was tireless and persistent. He must have gotten very close to the problem because it cost him his life. He suspected it would. St. Romero said, "When we leave Mass, we ought to go out the way Moses descended Mt Sinai: with his face shining, with his heart brave and strong to face the world's difficulties." We can learn from this wisdom. If we allow the power of the Mass to truly transform us, we will leave that holy encounter changed. Our face will shine, and we will have courage. We can then bring what we have received to life's challenges. That sounds doable, doesn't it? Because of the example of our simple holiness, people will be amazed.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: CARRIE WATKINS

HOW LONG HAVE YOU AND YOUR FAMILY BEEN MEMBERS OF THE PARISH?

I'm a Columbia local, went to Columbia Catholic (now OLLIS), but fell away from regular attendance for a few years. My son and I have been active members of Newman now for the past 15+ years. My dad is also a member of the Newman Center Parish.

WHAT MINISTRIES DO YOU VOLUNTEER WITH?

Currently, I enjoy serving as a lector (my dad is also a lector) and I also take the opportunity to work with the team of amazing volunteers who make and serve dinner through the Loaves and Fishes once a month. For many years, I also helped with Children's Liturgy, specifically with the 3rd and 4th graders.

HOW HAS YOUR SPIRITUAL LIFE GROWN THROUGH THE MINISTRIES YOU'RE INVOLVED IN AND HAS THE PANDEMIC **IMPACTED YOUR PARISH INVOLVEMENT?**

I loved helping with Children's Liturgy not only because the students asked a lot of good questions, but also because the readings and gospel were explained in a way that made it easy to share with the students. Those explanations were helpful for me to better understand what Jesus and the prophets were trying to tell us.

Now as a lector, it's a whole new experience with the readings. As I prepare, I get to think about how to best share the Word with the community and convey meaning through how I present it. It's been a wonderful experience.

Being low-risk for complications from COVID, the pandemic has allowed me more opportunities to be a lector and continue to provide the readings during Mass. With this being a time of change personally, the involvement in the parish has been a welcome constant.







A STEWARD'S WAY

WHO WE ARE: 2021 SEASON OF **STEWARDSHIP**

Serving in a liturgical ministry is one way to steward your gifts at Mass. The great news about volunteering at Mass is that you have a variety of options for service, all which require different gifts!



- Greeter/Usher: Especially during the pandemic, Newman is in need of people who are able to greet people as they enter and help people find seats with appropriate social distancing. This requires you to arrive at Mass 20 minutes early and help people find "free" seats if the chapel fills. After Mass, the usher sanitizes the chapel by using a simple sprayer to spray down chairs. Spraying usually takes less than 5 minutes! We are in urgent need of this service; please reach out if you are willing to serve in this capacity. A short "on-the-job" training with an experienced usher is all you need to get started!
- Sound Board Operator: This behind-the-scenes role is crucial to allow everyone at Mass to participate! Sound board operators run the slides at Mass while also ensuring that microphones are on and at appropriate volume levels. You do need to have a level of comfort with technology in order to serve in this capacity, but we will also provide training to make sure that you know how to operate the systems in the chapel.
- Mass Coordinator: Sometimes also referred to as a sacristan, this person sets up for and cleans up after Mass. In the absence of an altar server and/or deacon, they also will assist the presider.
- Altar Server: Do you have children who would benefit from learning more about the Mass? Serving as an altar server allows children to have an important role during Mass that teaches them about the order of the Mass and why we do the things we do. All interested in being a server would receive training and shadowing with an experienced server. This ministry is open to children who are in their 2nd semester of 3rd grade or older.
- Lector: Do you love praying with scripture? If so, serving as a lector might be a good fit for you. With training, you will serve by proclaiming the word of God at Mass.
- Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (previously called Eucharistic Minister): EMHCs serve an important role assisting in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass. Some also volunteer to bring communion to the sick or homebound.
- Music Ministry: While we have a limited schedule right now due to COVID, singing or playing an instrument during mass is another way to use your gifts to glorify God.
