

From the Inside Out



pregnant woman walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed. "You are absolutely beaming!" The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes.

Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn't mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald's and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat.

A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new "digs," received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you're really "into it" this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it's only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual.

For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation.

If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God's call. Then, there is God's request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this

is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen.

STEWARDSHIP THROUGH **HOSPITALITY**

In times of COVID when thoughts of "hospitality" could be seen as opposed to social distancing, this is not so! Though hospitality can mean shaking hands and seeing a smile, this only just scratches the surface of the true meaning of Christian Hospitality. At its root, hospitality is Christian kindness: to know, see, and care about others, offering them a sense of belonging and welcome.

Mass is often a time that stewardship is most visible. Whether greeting (from afar), or even sharing a "good morning" over the livestream feed, we show hospitality to one another as we gather for worship.

This Season of Stewardship is also at time for our parish to invest time in updating parishioner records and interests so that we can better communicate with and serve each other.

- How can you show hospitality to others, even in a pandemic? Some ideas include:
- Sending a card or email to someone who just welcomed a new child, someone who is sick, someone who is grieving, someone who is lonely.
- Welcome your new neighbors with an UberEats (or related service) gift card.
- Schedule a phone call to catch up with those people you know who are living alone.
- Drop off a craft project for families who are virtual schooling or at home with sick kids.
- 0 Shovel the driveway of your neighbor.
- Invite someone to attend Mass with you (virtually or in person).
- Smile, even when wearing a mask! 0
- Make an extra gift to a charity who can help those who are struggling during the pandemic.
- Prayerfully consider how your gifts could be of use in our parish community. Share your interests through the Season of Stewardship intention card, or call the parish office to get connected to a ministry that fits your gifts.
