## HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

The first time I walked through the doors of Newman during a Mizzou visit about 3 years ago, I had a voice inside of me saying, "This is where I am meant to be." I didn't know it at the time, but I was on my way to finding my home.

Leaving my hometown to start college was a daunting idea, and transitioning to living in Columbia the first few months of my freshman year wasn't the easiest task. It was Newman that allowed me to adjust to this big change and made Mizzou and Columbia become my home.

I very quickly got involved at Newman to keep my faith a priority during college. I jumped on every opportunity to attend a retreat, join a bible study when my friends recommended it, and attend other events like E3 and Mizzou Catholic outings to connect with my peers. I finally felt fully adjusted to Columbia at the beginning of my second semester of freshman year. I soaked up every second I could with the people around me any chance I could. Looking back, I'm so glad I did this because a couple weeks later was when COVID hit, causing me to move back to my hometown and readjust all over again. Every day I was in my hometown, I realized how much I missed Mizzou. Being away from the people I looked forward to seeing each day at the place I had come to love was extremely difficult. I missed home. Now, any time I spend in Columbia is much more meaningful and I won't take any time here for granted.

My view of what "home" is has changed since coming to Mizzou. For the longest time, it meant my family, my house, and places that I was familiar with, whether I lived there or just visited frequently on vacations. Now, "home" means so much more. Home is defined by the people I am surrounded by. The people who love me, who accept me for who I am with open arms, and who want to see me grow and be along for the journey. It is a place that brings joy, hope, comfort, and memories. It's all the places that felt like home growing up, and includes my current home in Columbia.

I have found this home at Mizzou through the relationships I have developed here, especially at Newman. The hours I have spent with my friends in the lounge, at coffee shops, or anywhere else in town have been filled with meaningful conversations, laughs, and memories that have created the comfort I have here in Columbia.

Over the past couple weeks, I've had a sign in my room that says, "Home is where the heart is." Everytime I look at it, I remember where my heart truly belongs. And I know there will always be a piece of my heart that belongs here at my home in Columbia.


