# CHRISTMAS UPDATE!

ome, let us adore. Let us adore the babe, the son of Mary. Our own St. John Henry Newman, as he was growing in his Catholic faith, gave the following reflection on that babe, the son of Mary, "He came by a new and living way; not, indeed, formed out of the ground, as Adam was at the first, lest He should miss the participation of our nature, but selecting and purifying unto Himself a tabernacle out of that which existed. As in the beginning, woman was formed out of man by

Almighty power, so now, by a like mystery, but a reverse order, the new Adam was fashioned from the woman. He was, as had been foretold, the immaculate 'seed of the woman,' deriving His manhood from the substance of the Virgin Mary." Remember, O Christian, your dignity. It's good for us simply to wonder, to be amazed, but most importantly, to receive the beautiful news of God revealing Himself...to you and me.

On a comparatively mundane note, I would like to reveal to you where we are with the name change request. On Wednesday, December 1, Bishop McKnight signed the letter that has subsequently been sent to Rome, to the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, which requests the approval of the Congregation to change our parish patron to St. John Henry Newman and to change the title of our church to St. John Henry Newman. It was a well written letter (the work of two canon lawyers) and includes abundant documentation of the process we have gone through to demonstrate the positive reasons for these requests. Now we wait. And we trust that God's will be done.

While our parish was going through the consultation process regarding a possible name change, Bishop McKnight was also going through a process with every parish of the diocese to confirm the date when the parish was formally established and to define the boundaries of the parish (his purpose for defining boundaries is not connected so much to parish membership, but rather to the pastoral plan for the diocese that every parish should be a center of charity and sanctuary of mercy; in other words, the boundaries help the Pastors to know their responsibilities for the poor and the needy in our areas). Included in this bulletin is the decree from Bishop McKnight regarding our Parish. As you can imagine, Newman is different! We are not a territorial parish with a defined geographical area. We are a personal parish, defined by our registered membership, and the decree from Bishop McKnight defines the membership for us (which is pretty broad :). With this decree now being published in our bulletin, the decree formally takes effect. Please read through the decree carefully, and if you have questions feel free to reach out to me.

I would like to close by stating that both Fr. Paul and myself are honored and humbled to serve in this beautiful and vibrant parish. May each of you have an overwhelming experience of God's love and joy this Christmas and always!






