











WHAT IS NEWMAN?

Since the beginning of the 1900s, special parishes & centers have been set up to serve the spiritual needs of Catholic students at universities & colleges. These parishes were named after St. John Henry Cardinal Newman.

Newman's motto is "Cor Ad Cor Loquitor," which means "heart speaks to heart." Whether that's with God, with another parishioner, or through Catholic tradition, we believe in the importance of speaking from the heart.



WHO IS ST. JOHN HENRY NEWMAN

St. John Henry Newman was an English educator and churchman from the 19th century. Pastorally and educationally, in his published writings and in his correspondence, Newman's aim was to describe and arouse the Christian mind. His vocation was to help modern people realize the demands of thinking and acting with the mind of Christ and His Church. St. John Henry Newman's feast day is October 9.



R - RECEIVE


Rest with God and allow Him to speak. It may be in scripture or thoughts. Be still, and remember God speaks even in silence.

R - RESPOND

Act on this time of prayer, and be open to where God is guiding you. Allow yourself to be changed.
